We have had a great start to the year and I thank you for all your organisation in support of this.


The starting days were a little bit varied, however, they enabled us to ease back into the routines and expectations of school life.

This is a day where we as teachers, learn so much about you and your family and anything that may have happened over the Christmas break. It also sets us up for success. As you as parents or caregivers have the opportunity to chat with your child's teacher by yourselves, plus you and your child know exactly where the class is and where to put your bags. This is such a great way to start as it means that the first full day of school starts like clockwork and everybody knows where to go and who to meet.

The Meet the Teacher evening is also a great time to come to the class and meet the other parents in the class while at the same time giving time to listen to the teacher and finding out how this new class will run. Thank you also for attending the session in the hall. I do hope you found this time informative to help with how things run daily in our school as well as the focus for this year.

Our definition of agentic learners is:

Agentic Learners are confident in their own
[needs], strengths and interests,
knowing what they are learning and
where they are heading to next.
Learners are supported and empowered to take ownership, choice, and action to navigate their
learning.

We want to work in partnership with you for the success of your child. Your first port of call if you have any questions is your class teacher, you can then ask the Team Leader of your child's class and then of course onto the Deputy Principal and then myself as Principal.

Many people in the school including other parents are willing to help (especially our new parents) and our lovely office staff are very understanding and helpful, so please do ask them if you are unsure.

We are looking forward to a year of great learning together.

Lunch Coordinator:

Prepare term roster of parent lunch volunteers for lunch days Wednesday to Friday.

Manage group on WhatsApp.

Provide feedback to Dollar for Schools Lunches about any lunch issues.

Coordinate and run the 'Sausage Sizzle Special Lunch', once a term with the greater PTA team.

Time Commitment:

Setup term lunch roster 2 hours at the start of each term.

Minimal time each week once lunches start rolling - occasionally needing to organise a lunch reliever from the roster if a helper is unavailable.

Special Lunch: Order food, organise volunteer helpers, get printed Kindo order lists, run the Special Lunch on the day morning till 1pm.
